CHANTRY CHINOOK CLASSIC SALMON DERBY FEBRUARY UPDATE

The derby committee and others continue to work hard at making the 2015 Derby another great success. We are again aiming to generate the funds necessary to assist the Club in operating the fish hatcheries along with their other initiatives. It is hoped that we can increase sponsorship and bring additional entrants, thus increasing revenues.

Members of the committee are continuing to seek sponsors for cash and prize board prizes. Both of these are of utmost importance to the success of the derby and to support the cash prizes and prize boards. We need to show our appreciation for the continued support of our sponsors by purchasing their products and services. Anyone who wishes to sponsor or knows someone who does, should contact any of the committee members or visit the website.

The committee is taking steps to further promote the derby. Online ads on the Bluewater Visitors guide, local municipal, Chamber of Commerce, and Explore the Bruce websites are to promote the Derby. Also, Explore the Bruce will be handing out promotional information at the Toronto Sportsman Show.

In the near future, tickets will be available from committee members and other ticket outlets. A new ticket outlet has come on board. A new store, Donkers Outdoors and Sports in Goderich will be selling Derby tickets in the near future.

2014 SPRING CREEK RESTORATION ACTIVITY UPDATE

The Hepworth Anglers Club continued Spring Creek restoration activities in 2014, with the total amount of stone placed in Spring Creek now surpassing 1,000 tonnes. Washed sub-angular river rock, round cobble stone, varying sized larger stone identical to the stone in Spring Creek and boulders were used to enhance/create 700 metres of spawning beds, to create riffle pools and to stabilize 300 metres of bank. Naturally reproducing chinook and coho salmon, as well as lake run brown trout, have already used the new spawning beds during the fall of 2014.

Habitat improvements included embedding cedar logs/trees into the creek bank, channel narrowing using sod blocks, planting cedar trees along the riparian shore and sowing grass seed on disturbed areas.

Migratory fish passage was enhanced by performing concrete repairs on and replacing all of the boards in the fish ladder. Boards were also replaced in the bottom draw dam, including improvements to the mechanism used to remove/replace boards, which will result in better management of a cool water temperature plume flowing downstream, benefitting Spring Creek, the Sauble River, and Lake Huron including Sauble Beach.

Dr. James Hamilton, of Wilfrid Laurier University, continued his monitoring activities/research on Spring Creek during 2014 and also gave two PowerPoint presentations on the Hepworth Karst Drainage System/Spring Creek to the: 1.) the Sauble and Area Men's Club and 2.) the South Bruce Peninsula Council. The Hepworth Anglers Club remains committed to raising public awareness of the minimally known Hepworth Karst Drainage System, which is the largest known karst drainage system in Southwestern Ontario and of which Spring Creek is a component.

2014 Spring Creek Restoration activities were made possible with a Recreational Fisheries Conservation Program Grant from the Department of Fisheries and Oceans and a Great Lakes Guardian Community Fund Grant from the Ontario Ministry of Environment.

Additional restoration efforts are scheduled to continue in 2015.
